



## Jelly Roll Rug with J'Ann McEwen

Back by popular demand! The rug is oval shaped and finishes at approximately 30" x 44". Please note that there will be prep work before class and homework after the first week so that you may assemble the rug the second week.

**Skill Level: Confident Beginner, \$40**  
**WYOMING - Weds Jun. 9 & 16; 1:30 - 4:30 pm**

**Before class, please sew your jelly roll strips together as indicated in the pattern** — that is end to end — so that you have a long continuous strip. I joined mine on a 45 degree angle just as I would a binding on a quilt. Use a 2.0 stitch length. Trim the seams to 1/4" and press the seams open. Also please pre-wind at least 3 bobbins. You may pick either a neutral or colored thread to encase the Bosal in and a neutral or colored thread for the zig zagging.

### Supply List:

#### Jelly Roll Rug Pattern (30 x 44" oval)

1 40-piece jelly roll **OR** 4 2 1/2" x WOF strips of 11 different fabrics

1 50 foot roll of Bosal **2.5"** wide 100% cotton batting (not fusible)

2 jeans sewing machine needles, size 14 - 18 (Note that sometimes when I am using the Bosal I have skipped stitches. In that event I have had good luck with using a 90 stretch, 90 Topstitch or 90 Microtex needle.)

1 - 2 large spools of 100% cotton thread, at least 1200 yards

Best Press

At least 10 Wonder Clips

Sewing machine, cord, foot, etc.

Walking foot (or Dual Feed if that is what your machine has) if you have one — highly recommended for rug assembly

Basic sewing supplies including:

Scissors

Seam ripper

Straight pins

Rotary cutting mat (18" x 24" recommended)

Rotary cutter

Small ruler measuring at least 6" in length for tapering end of jelly roll

Stripology or other ruler if you are cutting your own strips

Small iron and ironing pad if you prefer to iron next to your machine.

Sew Steady table if you have one

Quilting gloves if you have them (op)
