You will learn about stabilizers, design editing, design placement, applique, zipper insertion, and free-standing techniques. Participants will work through the projects at their own pace and therefore are welcome to join the class at any time.

- clips

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Project Specific Supply List

1. Embroidery on towel
2. Embroidery with name on towel
3. Embroidery on t-shirt

You will need a Baby Lock embroidery machine, embroidery thread and embroidery designs for each project. Most projects can be completed with any Baby Lock embroidery machine including those with a 4"x4" hoop. Many projects can be completed with designs that are built into your machine or from your stash of designs. Tools such as sewing scissors, thread scissors, applique scissors, erasable marking pens, and pins will be useful for most of the projects. In addition, you will need unique items such as towels, t-shirts and, stabilizer for individual projects. While many of these items are available at the store, you will need to acquire some items before class. There is a supply list available for each project. Please note that you get 10% off notions purchases at the store on class days.

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Embroidery on Towel Supply List



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn about a few stabilizers and how to position an embroidery design.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- Embroidery design on machine or from stash
- Light or medium weight tear away stabilizer if your towel is light to medium weight. Thick towels are more difficult to embroider and require a sticky back stabilizer or 505 spray.
- Topper stabilizer – OESD StitchH2O Wash Away
- Hand towel, bath towel and washcloth, kitchen towel or any desired combination of towels
- Perfect Placement Templates – Lakeshore Sewing Number 7726A

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Embroidery with Name on Towel Supply List



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn about a few stabilizers and how to position an embroidery design. In addition, you will learn how to add text to a design and edit your text. Some embroidery machines will require two hoopings to complete this project.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- Embroidery design on machine or from stash
- Light or medium weight tear away stabilizer if your towel is light to medium weight. Thick towels are more difficult to embroider and require a sticky back stabilizer or 505 spray.
- Topper stabilizer – OESD StitchH2O Wash Away
- Hand towel, bath towel and washcloth, kitchen towel or any desired combination of towels
- Perfect Placement Templates – Lakeshore Sewing Number 7726A

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Embroidery on T-Shirt Supply List



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn about a few stabilizers and how to position an embroidery design on a t-shirt.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- Embroidery design on machine or from stash
- Polymesh cut away stabilizer
- Topper stabilizer – OESD StitchH2O Wash Away
- T-shirt (larger sizes are easier to embroidery)
- Perfect Placement Templates 7726A
- Iron-on backing to cover design on inside (reduces itchiness) – OESD Gentle Touch

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Applique onto Pillowcase



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn how to applique in-the-hoop.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- Applique embroidery design on machine or from stash – There are many available on-line. Check the overall size of the design to ensure it will fit in your hoop and on a pillowcase.
- Medium weight cut away stabilizer
- Topper stabilizer – OESD StitchH2O Wash Away
- Pillowcase
- Fabric to place in the applique. Scraps work great for applique designs.
- Applique scissors are highly recommended. They are small with curved blades. Kai makes an excellent quality pair and they are available at Lakeshore Sewing.

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Free Standing Leaves



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn about hooping with organza, a few differences between rayon and polyester thread and how to cut out a design with a stencil cutting tool.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- RAYON Embroidery thread
- organza fabric, approximately ¼" yard
- lace fabric to applique onto leaves if desired
- stencil cutting tool Lakeshore Sewing part number 34008 - (you may borrow mine during class)
- Embroidery Design – I digitized a simple leaf which will be provided.
- Recommended - Anita Goodesigns Vintage Free-Standing Leaves
- Recommended – John Deer's Embroidery Legacy – 3D Effects Fall Leaves

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Texture Magic Flower



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn about free standing flowers, texture magic and cutting with a stencil tool.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- RAYON Embroidery thread
- organza fabric, approximately ¼" yard
- Texture Magic stabilizer – Lakeshore Sewing part number - PPMAGIC301
- stencil cutting tool Lakeshore Sewing part number 34008 - (you may borrow mine during class)
- Embroidery Design – I digitized a simple flower which will be provided.
- Recommended – John Deer's Embroidery Legacy – 3D Flowers

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Free Standing Snowflake



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. In this project you will learn about free standing lace and wash away stabilizer.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- wash away stabilizer – OESD Aquamesh
- Recommended to be used in conjunction with wash away, but not required - badge master stabilizer – OESD Badge master
- At least one free standing lace snowflake design – you can download through OESD, or we can help you order one through OESD designs
- Recommended – OESD Holly Jolly Ornaments and Accents

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Stained Glass Ornaments



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and cannot be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. You will need a 5"x7" hoop to complete this project. If you do not have a machine with these capabilities, but have attended this class in the past Lakeshore Sewing has a limited number of machines that can be borrowed to complete this project.

In this project you will learn how to applique with vinyl and organza in-the-hoop.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- White organza fabric, approximately ¼" yard
- Colored organza fabric for applique pieces, scrapes, or 5"x7" pieces
- Vinyl – Lakeshore Sewing part number CT20302
- Applique scissors are highly recommended. They are small with curved blades. Kai makes an excellent quality pair and they are available at Lakeshore Sewing.
- RAYON Embroidery thread
- stencil cutting tool Lakeshore Sewing part number 34008 - (you may borrow mine during class)
- Embroidery Designs Required – Anita Goodesigns Stained Glass Ornaments or Anita Goodesigns Circular Stained Glass Windows

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Basic Bookmark



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and cannot be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. You will need a 5"x7" hoop to complete this project. If you do not have a machine with these capabilities, but have attended this class in the past Lakeshore Sewing has a limited number of machines that can be borrowed to complete this project.

In this project you will learn how to use your machine to load multiple designs, use your stitch advance button, move, modify and edit designs.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- wash away stabilizer – OESD Aquamesh
- felt recommended; or fleece fabric; or cotton fabric and batting and décor bond.
- ribbon
- awl
- Terial Magic – Optional – Spray Fabric Stabilizer
- Embroidery Design – I digitized a blank bookmark which will be provided.
- Embroidery Design from stash – you will be able to add a small design from your stash
- Recommended - Anita Goodesigns Spring & Summer Bookmarks
- Recommended – Anita Goodesigns Holiday Bookmarks
- Recommended – Anita Goodesigns Vintage Bookmarks

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Basic Purse



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and cannot be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. You will need a 5"x7" or 8"x12" hoop to complete this project. If you do not have a machine with these capabilities, but have attended this class in the past Lakeshore Sewing has a limited number of machines that can be borrowed to complete this project.

There are a wide variety of purse project that can be completed in-the-hoop available for purchase. Most incorporate a few basic steps and then add variations that make the designs unique. In this project we will cover the basic steps for in-the-hoop purse construction.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- Baby Lock embroidery machine with 8"x12" hoop or 5"x7" hoop
- Tape
- Tear away stabilizer
- Zipper
- Lower Fabric, 2 pieces (inside and outside) 6.5"x7.5", 6"x6.5"
- Lower Front, stitch witchery 6.5"x7.5", 6"x6.5"
- Top and back fabric, 2 pieces, 6.5"x11", 6"x9"
- Top and back, stitch witchery 6.5"x11", 6"x9"
- Embroidery Design – I digitized a blank purse which will be provided.
- Embroidery Design from stash – you will be able to add a design from your stash
- Recommended – Anita Goodesigns Jelly Roll Bags
- Recommended – Anita Goodesigns Snack Bags

Baby Lock Beginning Embroidery: Custom Labels



This is a beginning embroidery class for those using Baby Lock embroidery machines and can be completed with a 4"x4" hoop. You will need a machine with embroidery editing capabilities such as the Flourish II, Adventura II and up. If you do not have a machine with these capabilities, but have attended this class in the past Lakeshore Sewing has a limited number of machines that can be borrowed to complete this project. In this project you will learn how to create your own custom labels.

Level: Beginner

Supplies

- wash away stabilizer
- fabric for label background
- batting or battalizer
